Disability Allowance

We pay up to a maximum of \$65.36 a week for Disability Allowance and it's not taxed. How much you get depends on the extra costs you have because of your disability.

Anyone receiving a main benefit automatically meets the income criteria for Disability Allowance. Below are the income limits for non-beneficiaries and New Zealand Superannuation clients, at 1 April 2020:
